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Memorandum of Support for the New York State Climate and Community Protection Act

As faithful stewards of the environment, the members of Interfaith Impact of NYS call on the Senate to pass the New York State Climate and Community Protection Act, S08005 (2016 bill number). The bill was passed by the Assembly. We will support this bill again when it is introduced in 2017.
